

The school has a clear behaviour policy which is shared with children and parents. Children write a Class Charter (Golden Rules in EYFS) to which they all agree.

Assembly themes, including those presented by the children, discuss a range of issues which explore fairness and moral dilemmas. Events such as Remembrance Day are marked both in school and within the local community.

St Margaret's has a comprehensive PSHE curriculum in which focused lessons help to distinguish right from wrong. Timetabled reflection time facilitates discussion on local and world issues. Children learn mentoring skills through the House System, Buddy Programme and Peer Reading opportunities.
